FARM CREDIT GRANT AWARDED

The Delta Agricultural Society is the proud recipient of a \$6,000 grant through the Farm Credit Canada Agri-Spirit Fund. The grant will assist the Society in making the Main Exhibit Hall more energy efficient through the installation of additional insulation.



The FCC Agri-Spirit Fund, which is about helping community minded individuals and groups undertake projects that enhance the quality life in rural Canada, has supported 1,170 projects with an investment in excess of \$13.5 million.

Receipt of the FCC grant follows closely behind an influx of \$30,000 in funding from the Township of Rideau Lakes to assist with the purchase of a generator and new kitchen appliances for the hall. The Agricultural Society recently entered into agreement with the municipality to allow the Main Exhibit Hall to be used as a shelter in the event of a local emergency.

DELTA LEGION TAKES TOP PRIZE IN EUCHRE TOURNAMENT



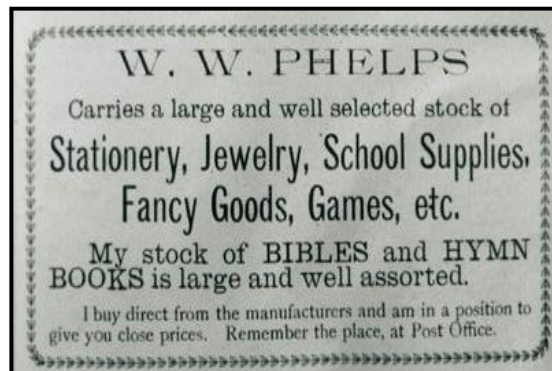

MUNICIPAL NEWS from Councillor Cathy Livingston

We have sure had our fair share of winter! Between snow storms, freezing rain, rain and then snow again, it has been difficult to get out and about. Township Staff have been plowing and sanding the roads and sidewalks almost everyday in January and so far in February to the point where the sand and salt domes had to be refilled at the end of January. Oh well, soon enough we will be complaining about the heat and bugs.

Council and Staff have been working on the 2019 budget with a strategic focus on fiscal sustainability, wise infrastructure investment, economic development and village / hamlet vitality. Our final budget meeting was held on February 19th with an initial cost of living increase at 2.3% but at Council's request, staff came back with changes that reflected a 1.9% tax increase.

Some budget highlights for our area will include 5 km of double surface treatment on the Daytown Road and the application of new loose top on Lakeshore Drive. Phase 1 funding for the Delta Waterfront project was approved so we now have to raise some funds towards the project as well. If anyone would like to make a donation to the Township of Rideau Lakes Delta Waterfront Project, you will receive an income tax receipt for any contribution over \$20. This is a huge project that will need the support of the community and the municipality. Please contact Liz Priebe at priebe.liz@gmail.com or myself if you would like to make a donation or become involved with fund raising for this project.

A new initiative this year will be the establishment of the Delta and Area Community Enhancement Committee which encompasses the communities of Delta, Chantry, Philipsville and Plum Hollow and includes the Beautification Committees, the DARS Recreation Sub Committee, the Fire Hall Museum Committee and perhaps the Delta Community Improvement Committee. This is an opportunity for our communities to work together as this new structure replaces 27 existing Boards along with the Joint Beautification Committee and the Joint Hall / Recreation Committee. As a Committee of Council, it will require a Chairperson, Treasurer, Secretary and volunteer members from the community. The establishing by-law should be passed in March so if you are interested in becoming a member of this committee, you will need to complete and submit a volunteer appointment form.

The Township went live this month with the release of a new website that showcases some new features which will allow residents to update their events on the calendar, fill out and update forms and request burn permits on-line.

The life of the Portland landfill site is coming to an end with its closure and capping being completed in the next 12 to 18 months. It has the capacity for at least a year but after that time, waste will need to be hauled away. In the future, both the Portland and Delta sites will continue to be used as transfer stations for recycling.
